- \$400 Larger Trees (Linden, Oak, Maple)
- \$200 Smaller Trees (Tree Hydrangeas, Cedar, Spruce)
- \$75 Shrubs (Hydrangeas, Mock Orange, Lilacs, Spirea, Aronia)
- \$25 Hostas

All categories are of substantial size and are hearty for the northern Maine climate. A memorial plaque will be provided for the large and small trees.
